External Relations (University/ DSU/ CFS)

- We have been working with DISA (International student Association) on a rally and sit-in to protest against the university's budget proposal. There is a second rally on April 16th (the date of the BOG meeting)
- Organizing transition meetings with incoming DSU & DAGS Executives
- Met with Dr. Newhook and DEGS being organized to continue focus on graduate student issues. TA drop-in space was created to respond to concerns and students are incouraged to approach the Dean of Student Matters with any issues
- Working with FGS on its plans for new orientation programming
- There has been constant communications with members of the Faculty of Graduate studies, including meetings with Dean Dr. Marty Leonard. One focus is to develop a Brightspace page that is jointly managed by DAGS and FGS to communicate with all graduate students more effectively.
- A meeting was held with the Mental Health Commission of Canada to get feedback from graduate students on the mental health standard
- FGS Faculty Council meetings occur monthly (last Tuesday of the month) and we arehappy to bring forward any issues. The next meeting will be held Tuesday, April 23rd. The Decanal review search will be a key issue.
- The FASS Faculty Council meeting was Tuesday, April 9th. A key focus is to ensure graduate student voices are captured in the Faculties new strategic plan.
- There are weekly contributions to the Faculty newsletter (*Submissions are sentweekly on Wednesday evenings. Should anyone desire to submit to theFaculty newsletter, please submit updates to president@dags.ca). At the same time,submissions are made to the FGS social media coordinator if there is anything you wantshared on through FGS social media channels.
- We have set up monthly meetings with the Dalhousie Faculty Association (DFA) to identify common advocacy areas, and gain feedback on how to advance initiatives, suchas faculty-wide policies regarding stipends, research assistant positions, and TApositions. We looking to coordinate around the university budget process.
- The next Government Round Table will be in May and attended by the new executive
- Met with Provost and VP Finance on University Budget Proposal voicing student concerns

- Met with Peter MacKinnon and staff to discuss issues including budget proposal
- The Provost is creating a position to focus on the Graduate Student Experience (ex. Supervisor student relations)
- Internal review of University's sexualized violence policy
- Review of the Ombudsperson Office
- Attended the Women in Research Committee Meeting
 - Focus on improving conditions for parents (researchers and students)
