Candidate Questions

1. What do you see as the top 3 issues for Dalhousie's graduate and professional students?

As an undergraduate student I am unable to understand the unique experiences of Graduate Students; however, through consultations with graduate students I've heard:

- Lack of

As many Graduate Students are involved in their academics and faculties, this allows for the DSU to reach out to more Graduate Students. This also allows for new students to have a better introduction to their program, faculty, student union and university.

I will program events to recognize exceptional student advancements, and allow for interactive project presentations of various disciplines in the SUB. One of Dalhousie's biggest initiatives is research; however, very little student life programming reinforces this initiative and the gap between the DSU and Graduate Students will continue to grow.

I will also work with DAGS and other societies to establish workshops and discussions surrounding Health, especially Mental Health. This can include cycling trips, Checking in, diet etc.

I will determine 3 questions or areas of interest, pre-determined by the President of DAGS and I, to critically analyze how accessible an event is for Graduate Students.
